If one of the persons having a former spouse still living is from another diocese, that person must petition, through a priest, the bishop of that diocese. Permission is given for the petitioning minister, or any minister of this diocese to solemnize the marriage. Permission can be given by the Bishop for a minister from another diocese to solemnize the marriage. Consent forms will be sent in duplicate. One copy should be returned promptly, indicating the date of the marriage. Should the proposed marriage be canceled, both copies should be returned so indicating. Please do not send divorce decree(s) or the Declaration of Intention.
